



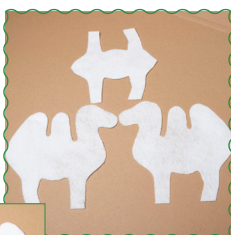
Camels can store energy from food and water for days or even weeks! Like the wise men, who likely traveled by camel, God will guide us and provide for all of our needs (Isaiah 58:11).

YOU WILL NEED:

- White Felt
- Black Felt
- Green Felt
- Yellow Felt
- Imitation Fur
- Black Marker
- Colorful Yarn
- White Twine
- Stuffing Fiber Fill
- Thick White Thread
- Stuffing Fiber Fill
- 2 Googly Eyes
- Thread
- Scissors
- Needle
- Paper
- Pencil
- Hot Glue



DIRECTIONS:



1. Draw or print (see attachment) the outline of a camel on a piece of white paper. Use the paper pattern to cut two pieces from white felt. Also cut out the piece for the camel's belly and inner legs.



5. Sew or glue pieces of black felt around the camel's feet.



9. Make a braid from three strands of multicolored yarn.



2. Sew all three pieces together leaving a small opening.



6. To make the tail, hot glue or sew a piece of imitation fur to the end of a piece of white twine. Cut out eye-shaped pieces and eyelids from black felt. Glue the googly eyes in the center.



10. Sew the pairs of green pieces together along the bottom. Sew or glue a braid along the upper edges of the saddlebags. Attach the two bags together.



3. Through the opening, pack the camel's legs tightly with stuffing fiber fill, then the head and so on, ending with the body.



7. Hot glue or sew a thin strip of imitation fur over the camel's humps and neck. Hot glue or sew on the tail, eyes and eyelids.



11. Make white felt ears for the camel. Make a braid of multicolored yarn for a bridle. Tie the bridle around the camel's head.



4. Sew a little tuck between each set of legs to help give the camel more stability. Sew up the opening.



8. Cut out 4 pieces of green felt for the saddlebags. Cut out two yellow felt decorations for the bags. Glue or sew the yellow decorations onto the green pieces.



12. Place the two saddlebags on the camel's back. The camel is ready to follow you!
