



Forgiving Horse

Horses are known to forgive each other by sharing hay and even forgive their trainers. Matthew 6:14 reminds us that we, too, should forgive.

YOU WILL NEED:

- White Yarn
- Black Yarn
- Red Yarn
- Ruler
- Scissors
- 2 Googly Eyes
- Cardboard 7x3"
- Cardstock Paper 1x2"
- Hot Glue Gun



DIRECTIONS:



1. Cut 2 red strands and 1 white strand of yarn 30" long and make into a braid. Knot the ends.



2. Cut 10 to 15 strands of black yarn 7" long and tie them together.



3. Cut two ears from cardstock and wrap them with white yarn. Secure the yarn with glue.



4. Wrap white yarn around a 7x3" piece of cardboard.



5. Tie the white yarn tightly in the middle with black yarn. Flip the cardboard over and cut the white yarn down the middle.



6. Fold the white yarn bundle in half, with the black tied portion showing. Tightly tie two sets of 2 strands of red yarn around the muzzle, about 1" from the mouth. Knot the two strands of yarn on each side.



7. Tie the braid at the neck as shown.



8. Knot the red yarn at the top of the head and cut off the excess. Fold the white yarn down and tie a red yarn joining the muzzle to the middle of the neck. Trim ends.



9. Glue the eyes, ears, and mane in place.



10. Trim a few strands of mane to form the forelock (bangs). Tie the braid into a bow. The horse's head is ready to decorate your school backpack.
