



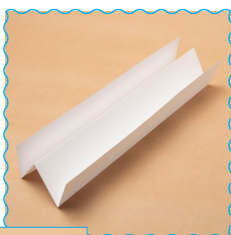
Sailboats are made to sail freely on the water. Jesus wants us to have freedom by receiving His forgiveness and forgiving others (Matthew 5:23-24).

YOU WILL NEED:

- Transparent Tape
- Blue Foam Sheet
- Red Foam Sheet
- Hole Punch
- 2-3 Skewers
- 2-3 Straws
- Thin Cardboard
- Hot Glue Gun
- Marker
- Paper
- Stapler
- Scissors
- Thread



DIRECTIONS:



1. Fold a piece of paper in half lengthwise. Fold both long edges up to the center fold.



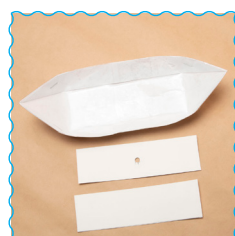
2. Fold all the corners up to the center fold. Fold all the corners in half again so that the edge meets the center fold.



3. Staple through all the thicknesses of paper at each corner, not including the center fold.

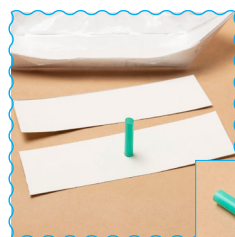


4. Fold the sides up to the center fold. Tape or glue the loose side flaps together.

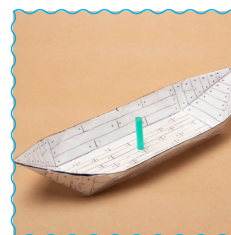
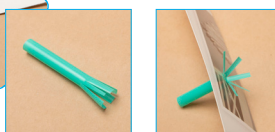


5. Open the boat out, allowing the ends to curl upward. The center fold becomes the flat bottom of the boat.

6. Cover the boat with several layers of clear tape, overlapping it so water won't be able to get through to the paper.



7. Cut out two strips of thin cardboard that are the same width and length as the bottom of the boat. Stick a piece of tape in the middle of one strip and make a hole in the middle of this strip.



9. Spread the cut ends of the straw and glue the other strip of cardboard over it. Cover well with tape. Glue this piece to the bottom of the boat. Decorate the boat with a marker however you like.



10. Cut out sails and a flag for the boat from foam. Glue pieces of skewer along the bottom of the sails. Glue the ends of them to a long upright piece of skewer and secure with thread.



11. Cut a few pieces from the straw, and make a cut through them lengthwise. Stick them down into the straw in the boat. This will hold the mast upright while still allowing it to turn.



12. Trim off excess length from the bottom of the mast. Put the mast in its place. The sailboat is ready to navigate freely over the water.
