

Egrets eat bugs that bother the cattle; and cows help the egret by stirring the ground. An egret can often be found on the back of a cow. Do you have things that bother you? Just pray to God and He can take away things that bother you (1 Peter 5:6-7).

## YOU WILL NEED:

- 1 Pine Cone
- 1 Acorn
- 1 Jar Lid
- 1 Toothpick
- 1 Wood Skewer
- Feathers

- Tissue Paper
- Wire
- Paints
- Brushes
- Black Marker
- Red Marker
- School Glue
- Hot Glue Gun Q
- Scissors
- Plier Cutters



## **DIRECTIONS:**



1. Bend wire to make a neck. Then glue the wire to the acorn. Let dry.



4. Glue the head/neck to the base of the pine cone. Glue two legs onto side of pinecone. Let dry. Glue foot to the top of lid. Let dry.



2. Cut and bend two small wires for feet. Wrap feet, neck, and head with tissue paper and glue in place. Let dry.



5. Paint the egret. Cut a toothpick in half, then color with red marker and glue onto the head to make a beak. Draw eyes with black marker.



3. Cut skewer into two pieces 2½" long to make legs. One leg may bend at the knee by cutting one in half with pliers, then gluing the bent leg. Glue feet to legs. Let dry.



6. Attach a few feathers for the tail and wings. Your egret is ready!
