YOU WILL NEED:

- Black Cardstock Paper
- 2 Small Plastic Bottles
- Smooth Plastic Bottle
- Black Paint
- Brush
- Wire
- Floral Tape
- Newspaper
- Aluminum Foil
- 2 Googly Eyes
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Diagonal Cutters
- Hot Glue Gun
- Black Permanent Marker



DIRECTIONS:

	<p>1. Shape newspaper into a ball approx. 2½" in diameter for the head. Wrap head in aluminum foil, then roll it around to smooth out any rough edges.</p>		<p>5. From a smooth plastic bottle, cut two 3" x 2" pieces for the beak. Paint them black inside. Let them dry. Bend (the painted side should be inside).</p>		<p>9. Color the googly eyes with black marker and glue them onto the head.</p>
	<p>2. Cut off the neck of two small plastic bottles. Take one of the bottles and cut the bottom at an angle (see photo).</p>		<p>6. Paint the front of the head with black paint. Let it dry. Glue the beak.</p>		<p>10. Cut out 8 claws (1" x ½") using the smooth plastic. Paint black on one side. Let dry. Fold them painted side in.</p>
	<p>3. Bend the wire into the form of a bird foot and generously wrap it with floral tape. Make 2.</p>		<p>7. Cut out a lot of feathers from the black cardstock in three sizes: small (1½" x 1"), medium (3" x 1½"), and large (6" x 1½"). You can also cut out some dark gray feathers if you like.</p>		<p>11. Paint the feet and legs black and glue on the claws.</p>
	<p>4. Glue the two plastic bottles and the head together as shown. Stick the feet into the body and glue well.</p>		<p>8. Glue on the long feathers to make the tail, then glue the medium feathers on the back and stomach and finish up with the small feathers on neck and head.</p>		<p>12. A black, clever, obedient raven is ready!</p>
