YOU WILL NEED:

- Dense Styrofoam
- Modeling Material
- 4-8 Big Washers
- Poster Board
- Brown Felt
- Putty Knife
- Black Marker
- Paint Brush
- Scissors
- Paint
- Paper
- Napkins
- School Glue
- Glue Brush
- Utility Knife
- Hot Glue Gun



DIRECTIONS:



1. Draw the silhouette of a coyote on a piece of foam. A sample of the coyote is in the attached sheet.



5. Roll out the modeling material into thin, flat sheets. Apply them to the coyote's body.



9. Glue some large, heavy washers to the bottom. Glue poster board to the bottom. Glue pieces of paper napkin to the entire surface of the bookends. Let dry.



2. Cut away the foam around the outside of the silhouette.



6. Apply small pieces of modeling material around the neck to add volume. Mark the entire surface of the coyote's body to look like fur. Make indentations for the eyes, ears, muzzle and inside of ears. Let dry well.



10. Paint the bookends to look like rocks.



3. Cut around and between the legs to separate the right and left sides.



7. Paint the coyote's body a grayish-yellow color. (See picture) Let dry.



11. Glue felt to the bottom.



4. Shape the body of the coyote. Cut out the tail for the coyote and hot glue it to the body.



8. Cut out 4 larger pieces of Styrofoam and hot glue them together to make two "L" shapes. Add a few additional pieces of foam to the outside to make it look like rock. Additional shaping can be done by cutting away bits of the foam.



12. Mount the coyote on one of the pieces. Now you can stand your books up between the bookends.
