YOU WILL NEED:

- Empty Clear Plastic Bottle with Corrugated Surface
- Red and White Cardstock
- 1 Long, Empty Paper Can
- Wooden Sticks

- Battery Tealight
- Small Stones
- Poster Board
- Cardboard
- Black Marker
- Paper Napkins
- School Glue
- Brush for Glue
- String
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Paint
- Paint Brush
- Hot Glue
- Cutters



DIRECTIONS:





1. To make the main body of

lighthouse, cut out lots of 1/2"


x 11/2" rectangles from card-

board and glue them in even

rows around the can to look

like brickwork. Glue pieces of

paper napkin over the brick,



4. From another corrugated strip, make a ring with a diameter slightly larger than the section with the windows in it, so that it fits together nicely.



6. For the roof, cut out a 4" diameter circle from poster board. Cut out a small notch. Glue the circle together to make a small cone. Glue triangles of corrugated card-

5. Glue this ring on

top of the platform

you made in step 2.



board to the roof.

8. Cut a dozen 1" wooden sticks. Make holes along the edge of the light platform. Put the sticks into the holes and secure with a drop of glue. Wind two rows of string around the sticks.



9. Cut out a 2 1/2" section from the plastic bottle. Insert this plastic part inside of the light housing. Glue a flagpole with a red cardstock flag on the roof.



10. Cut out and glue together three 4" cardboard circles. Cover the edge with a strip of poster board. Paint it black. Glue a few pieces of cardboard to the bottom of the lighthouse tower, then glue it to the black platform. Glue the stones around the base.



11. Glue the light platform to the top of the tower. Make windows and a door for the lighthouse from white cardstock.



12. Turn the candle on and put it on top.

Insert the light housing into the ring on the platform. The lighthouse is ready to light the way for ships.
