

Monarch butterflies don't have horizontal lines on the bottom of their wings like their little imitators, called the viceroy. Solomon imitated the Lord, his words and actions matched causing others to ask about God. Let's imitate God in all we say and do (Isaiah 43:10)!

## YOU WILL NEED:

- 1 Wood Slice, ½" thick
- Black Construction Paper
- 2 Mini Clothespins
- Needle Nose Pliers \&


5. Glue a mini clothespin under the middle of each butterfly.

6. Fold the butterfly wings together.

7. Glue the folded end of a strip under each butterfly wing.


- Tape - Glue Stick
- Pencil - Awl - $\downarrow$
- Paper
- Scissors


## DIRECTIONS:



1. Make several holes with the awl in the center of the flat slice of wood.
2. Cut several pieces of wire 10 "-12" long. Twist a curl at one end of the wires. Glue the other end of the wires into the holes on the wood slice.

3. Cut out two identical butterflies, approximately 3" x 4", from stiff paper. Color as shown in the template, or print out the template and cut out and glue the monarch and viceroy butterflies.

4. Glue artificial flowers onto the wooden surface. Bend the wire into a pleasing shape.
5. Hold the strips against the sides of the clothespins. Trim the ends of the strips down to $1 / 4 "$ long.
6. Fold the ends of the strips over the clothespins and glue.
7. Trim the bristles from 2 pieces of pipe cleaner. Bend the ends into curls and glue them to the butterflies.

8. By squeezing the end of the clothespin, the butterfly will flap its wings. Clip the butterflies onto the curved wires. This can be a great gift for someone who likes to read about Solomon.
