YOU WILL NEED:

- 1 Plastic Container Newspaper Brush
- 1 Plastic Bottle
- Floral Wire
- Jute Twine • 1 Sheet Protector
- Double-sided Tape Cardstock

DIRECTIONS:



- **1.** Remove the bottom from the plastic bottle, cutting it off on an angle.
- Scissors
- Paint Markers
- Pencil Rocks
- Ruler • Foil
- 2 Googly Eyes Hot Glue Gun
 - Craft Knife

unnecessary parts and stickers from the plastic container. Poke a few holes in the bottom of the container if using for a planter.

6. Place a few handfuls of rocks in the container for ballast. Hot glue the bottle to the container.


7. Twist wires form two spirals.

8. Paint the head. neck and the antenna balls green. To make antennae. attach hot-gluing the two small balls to the ends of the spirals. Hot glue the antennae to the head.





9. Weave a braid from jute and glue a few rows over the seam between the snail's neck and its shell. Glue on eyes. Draw the mouth and nostrils. Tie a bow around the neck.



11. Glue the plastic-covered circle to the snail's shell. Glue jute braid around the edge.

12. The snail-pot is ready! You can use it for small item storage or a planter for your favorite plant.



2. Make two 1" balls and one 3" ball from newspaper. Wrap the balls in foil and roll the balls on the table to make them round.



3. Glue pieces of newspaper in a layer over the balls and the bottle. Let dry and repeat with a second layer. Let drv well.



4. Hot glue the large ball to the mouth of the bottle. Glue pieces of newspaper over the seam. Let it dry. Trim off excess newspaper from the edge of the bottle.
