YOU WILL NEED:

- Large Shoebox with a Flip-top Lid
 Poster Board
- Thread and Needle
- Small Black Beads
- Skewer 12" long

- Craft Sticks
- Googly Eyes Paint Brush
- Paint

Felt

Fabric

String

- Ribbon
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Paper
- Scissors
- 2 Binder Clips






Hot Glue Gun



DIRECTIONS:



- 1. Cut eight 1½" circles out of poster board. Hot glue skin-colored felt to the front, then add hair made from felt or varn. Make enough heads for two boys, two girls, one woman, one man, one old man, and one old woman. Hot glue the eyes. Hot glue all the heads onto craft sticks.
- 2. Cut out two 2" x 3" wedges and two 2" x 1½" wedges from poster board. Hot glue to the sticks to make the women and girls.
- 3. Cut sixteen 2" pieces from craft sticks for arms. Glue clothes made from felt or fabric to front and back.
- 4. Add an apron for the old woman and a bow at the neck for the woman.



5. Cut out the 11/2" x 3" Y-shaped pieces from poster board for the boys. Hot glue them to the sticks.

arms to the figures at the back. 7. Cut out two 11/2" x 3" wedges from poster board for the men. Glue a 11/2" cross-piece below the head for shoul-

ders. Glue wedges

with narrow end

downward.



8. Hot alue fabric to the arms. Glue the arms to the shoulders at the back. Then glue pieces of fabric or felt onto the front and back of the wedges.



9. Take the large shoebox and cut a window in the lid, leaving about a 1" frame around it. On the backside of the box, make two cuts all the way down to make a flap for your hands to reach through.



10. Open the lid so that it stands upright. Glue on a ribbon to keep the lid from opening too far. Fasten the skewer inside to prop the lid open.




11. Attach two binder clips to the top edge of the lid. Make a curtain from fabric and make a sleeve at the top. Run a piece of string through the sleeve and fasten it
