YOU WILL NEED:

- Black and Red Markers
 Decorations
- Masking Tape
- Battery-Powered Clock Kit and Battery

DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut out three to five 6" squares from cardboard. Cut out a 2 ¼ " square hole exactly in the middle of each of the squares. Glue the squares on top of each other.

6. Apply white paint to all the cardboard surfaces. Paint the numbers a different color. Let dry.



8. Bend a clock holder out of wire. Hot glue this on the back of the thick square above where the movement housing will go.



9. Insert the movement housing inside the large square, battery at the bottom. Slide several washers onto the shaft of the housing, until the last washer is just above the clock face.

10. Finish by following the instructions of the clock kit. (In our kit we first slid on the rubber


washer and next the brass washer.)



11. Slide on the small marked circle. Slide on a brass washer. Screw hex nut onto the shaft (not too tightly). Slide hour, minute, and second hands onto the shaft, pointing the hands to 12 o'clock.

12. In the lower right corner of the clock write: A Friend at all Times. Hot glue the numbers on. Insert the battery, set the hands to the correct time, and the clock is ready!

3. Cut out an 8 ½" circle and a 3" circle (use a compass) from cardboard. Cut the larger circle into four equal parts. Make a ¼" hole in the middle of the small circle.



4. Glue pieces of paper napkin to the surface and edges of the circles. Glue pieces of gauze and mesh to the sections of the larger circle. Let it dry.
