

Joash asked for the treasures collected to go toward repairing the temple. Aren't you glad that our treasure is in Heaven, like it says in Matthew 19:21?

## YOU WILL NEED:

- Cardboard
- Poster Board
- Masking Tape
- Paper Napkins
- Lace, Ricrac, Cord
- 2 Brad Fasteners
- 2 Key Rings
- 2 Small Hinges
- Split Peas
- Compass

DIRECTIONS:


1. From cardboard, cut out 4-8x4" rectangles. These will be used for the front and back Cut out 4-5x4" rectangles for the sides, and $2-5 \times 71 / 4$ " rectangles for the bottom.

2. Glue two rectangles of the same size together to make one rectangle. Repeat for all the pieces. Fit the pieces together to make a box and glue.
3. Using a compass, draw two circles on cardboard, making the diameter the same as the width of the box. Cut the circles out and cut them in half. Glue each set of two semicircles into one.
4. Measure the outside
 edge of the semicircle. Cut a rectangle from cardboard using this measurement for the length and $7 \frac{1}{4}$ " for the width. The corrugations should go from side to side. Glue the sides of the cardboard to the round edge of the semicircles.

5. The area of the lid and the box must match. If not, glue a few sheets of cardboard to the box to make up the difference. Cover all edges with masking tape.

6. Make 4 cardboard pieces 3 " wide at the top, $11 / 2$ " at the bottom and 1 " high. Glue to the bottom corners of the chest and cover with tape. Glue paper napkins over the inside and outside of the chest. Let dry.
7. Apply decorations to the outside of the box and lid. Use lace, thin cardboard strips or poster board strips, cord, ricrac, and split peas.

8. Hot glue two hinges between the back of the chest and the lid.
9. Hot glue decorative hasp on the front of the chest. Now you have a chest to hold all your little treasures.
