YOU WILL NEED:

- Ribbon
- 1 Kazoo
- Paintbrush
- Tacky Glue
- Sandpaper
- Black Marker
- Dense Styrofoam
- Brad Fasteners
- Paint
- Paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Craft Knife



DIRECTIONS:



1. Lay the kazoo on a piece of paper. Draw the outline of a trumpet around it with a marker. Cut it out.



5. Open the pieces out. Make a cut at a 90 degree angle along the lines on both pieces. Continue carving until you have a notch about ½" deep.



9. Paint the trumpet. Let dry. Decorate the trumpet with brads on both sides, fastening with glue.



2. Using this paper pattern, cut two trumpet shapes from dense Styrofoam.



6. Mark the place where you will need to make an opening for the sound hole of the kazoo. Carve out the hole on each side. Put the pieces together to check the fit and adjust as needed.



10. Insert the kazoo underneath.



3. Lay the pieces down, one facing left and one facing right. Round and shape the edges of the top sides only.



7. Glue the pieces to each other. Press them firmly. Let the glue dry. Carefully trim off any unevenness around the edges, giving the trumpet a streamlined shape.



11. Cut about 80" of ribbon. Fold it in half and toss folded end around your shoulder. Tie a knot where you want the trumpet to hang.



4. Press the two pieces together. Draw two lines on the underside of the trumpet as wide as the kazoo. The mouth of the kazoo must stick out from the trumpet at least an inch.



8. Sand the entire surface of the trumpet. Cut two shallow grooves around the trumpet on either side of the hole.



12. Tie the free ends of the ribbon to the grooves of the trumpet. Blow your trumpet to proclaim God's victory in your life.
